Spam Reuben Sandwich

12-oz can SPAM, cut into 8 slices 8 slices rye bread 3 tbsp butter, softened 8-oz can sauerkraut 1 cup grated Swiss cheese 1/4 cup Thousand Island dressing

Rinse and drain sauerkraut. Mix together sauerkraut, cheese and dressing. Spread 1/4 of the sauerkraut mixture on each of 4 unbuttered bread slices. Top

each with 2 slices SPAM. Top with remaining slices of rye bread and butter the outsides of the bread. Grill over medium heat in skillet or griddle until cheese melts and sandwiches are browned on both sides.

Makes 4 sandwiches

Nitro can mute aroma and leave bitterness, so we used heavy doses of dry hopping to achieve the bold hop character we love.
